

# FEEDER WITH GRILLE GATE FOR HORSES, 12 OPENINGS

## Feeder with 12 feed openings which is designed and adapted for horses

- 12 feed openings
- Grille gates
- Adjustable roof height
- 3 base supports provide good stability
- Adapted for round/large bales

The grille gates, made of robust tubing with 50 mm of space between them, provide a high level of safety and ensure the roughage stays in the feeder. Feed can be replenished quickly and easily by opening any of the four grille gates which open out to the side. Three 325 m wide feed openings on each side in each grille gate ensures minimum feed waste.

The roof is height-adjustable to offer the best protection against precipitation, and is also fitted as standard with a protection arch all the way around to offer the horses maximum safety.

Three base supports ensure that the feeder is stable and does not sink into the ground in wet conditions.

There are in-built pallet fork insertion points to move the feeder safely and stably, which also means there are no protruding brackets, thus avoiding injuries. The entire feeder is galvanised for a long service life.

**NOTE!** Any plastic film/netting around the hay bale must be removed before use.

# Using the feeder gives you a number of benefits:

- Reduction in feed waste
- Improved hygiene at the feeder
- Less feed is required as it is not trampled on or not eaten by the animals

### Important factors to consider when choosing a feeder for horses

Even though horses all belong to the same species, there are many different breeds, and therefore different behaviours, from long nerve fibres to short explosive nerve fibres. You know your horses' behaviour and what is best for them, and in order to avoid injuries we ask you to think about how the horses react in various contexts where a feeder is involved.

The number of horses that can gather around a feeder is decisive for the size of the feeder and how many feeders are appropriate. Remember that the less space there is around a feeder, the greater is the risk of injury. You yourself are responsible for your choice of feeder model, since you know your horses best.

Please consider your livestock and their needs when choosing a feeder. Always follow your country's agricultural rules and animal welfare regulations.
